DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Member Escobar-Ryan inquired if information was available regarding Bay Bluffs Park that could be shared with the board to share with the community, so the community could have a voice in what happens next. Interim Director, Byrd stated the first step will be to have public input to help understand what the public wants which will determine what goes back there. The terrain will be a challenge and there will be ADA requirements. There is a plan in development. The first phase we will be to obtain an assessment as this will give us a good recommendation to help develop a plan to go forward whether we are able to salvage some parts or if it needs to be completely replaced.

Member Borden inquired if staff could create a report with basic information such as the age of the park, what kind of shape it's in, and what the engineers are looking at for the board members to present to the public. Interim Director, Byrd stated she is in the process of creating a

report and will have a preliminary report available next month.

Member Bruni inquired if the city has plans to change the use or the control of the Scenic Heights Park. Interim Director Byrd stated she was unaware of anything involving Scenic Heights Park she will look into it and get back to the board.

Member Harrison spoke regarding the soccer fields being flooded when it rains. Member Harrison asked if plans are being developed for improvements to the soccer fields. Interim Director, Byrd stated she is aware of the need for improvements and will begin looking into it.

Member Wolf shared with the board that he is willing to speak with Park Superintendent Kimball to understand the flooding issue and will take a look at the Hitzman Soccer fields to see if he can determine what is needed to improve the drainage.

STAFF REPORTS

MARKETING - DEJA DOWDELL

Deja Dowdell, Marketing Coordinator brought before the board a presentation providing a brief overview of the budget and what she does regarding marketing for the Parks and Recreation Department.

The 2023 Fiscal Year budget for marketing for the Parks and Recreation Department was around \$95,000. This budgeted amount is what's available to spend to disseminate information out to the community. The budget is allocated between four categories:

- *Office of the Director (43 percent), e.g., specifically our parks and general programming

- *Community Maritime Park (28 percent), e.g., larger events such as Blues on the Bay, Movies in the Park

- *Recreation (15 percent), e.g., Outdoor Pursuits, After School Programming

- *Golf (14 percent)

The goal is to create an inclusive environment by reaching out to the community to ensure that they know of all the programs, and they know of all the events. To get the information out to the community the following means are used:

*Promotional Advertisement: Traditional Mediums - Flyers, Newspaper, Magazine Publication, Activity Guide, Television and Radio; New Media - Digital and Email Marketing

*Community Partnerships: Solicit event sponsorship to partner with agencies throughout the Pensacola region to amplify community resources, increase engagement, improve the quality of life for residents and citizens, mutually reach to targeted audiences to increase brand affinity.

*Social Media: Ad Segments, daily post engagement, strategize ad expenditure and reach, increase page following. Outlets - Facebook, X (Twitter) and Instagram handle @PlayPColaParks. Each active social media page has seen a variant 4% - 108% increase since Oct 22

Member Wolf asked if the cost to publish and print the pamphlets come out of the budget. Marketing Coordinator, Dowdell responded, yes it comes out of the Office of Director's budget. Member Wolf asked who is responsible for distributing the pamphlets around the city. Marketing Coordinator, Dowdell responded, she has over twenty locations that she distributes material to. Member Wolf asked if she was the graphic designer as well. Marketing Coordinator, Dowdell responded that she collaborates with a media company where together they go over the layout and storyboard everything.

Another media outlet that is trending now are the QR codes it is an affordable resource that enables a great reach and a lot of variables.

To spark interest in participation of the City's Senior Games we worked with our billboard partner to help advertise the winners of the Pensacola Senior Games who had gone on to be the National Winners by displaying a picture of them on a billboard.

Another component of marketing for Parks and Recreation is to solicit sponsorships for our programs to help raise dollars to help with the bottom line to provide programs for the public and also to partner with organizations throughout the city who want that exposure to reach our audiences.

The Cultural Affairs will have a subpage under Programs and Events that will launch by the beginning of the new year.

PARKS UPDATES:

- Bayview Park Erosion Control/Stabilization Project – Construction has commenced installation of erosion controls measures and mobilization efforts. Approximately 60 days (weather permitting)
- Bruce Beach Phase I – Construction Phase: Installation of landscaping, site lighting, and trees has commenced. Some additional concrete work and electrical wiring is ongoing.
- Bruce Beach Phase 2 – Pre-Construction Phase; Anticipated commencement to begin November. Anticipated completion end of summer 2024.
- Mallory Heights #2 Drainage Improvements – Engineering and Design phase. Survey has been completed.
- Roger Scott Tennis Courts – Construction Phase; Pavement is complete will cure for 30 days before continuing. Anticipated completion Winter 2023.

SPECIAL PROJECTS:

- Bay Bluffs Structural Assessment – Temporarily closed; Boardwalk contains a considerable amount of rot and deterioration. Researching grants and other funding sources for providing future improvements and access.
- Roger Scott Pool Building – Design Phase; Replacing restrooms, pool operations offices, and equipment/chemical storage.
- Sanders Beach Park Amenities Upgrade and Kayak Launch Project – Design Phase; FWC awarded the grant for development of an ADA accessible kayak launch and other park improvements.
- 17th Avenue Boat Ramp and Pedestrian Access – Design Phase; Public Works managing project for improvements to the boat ramp, pedestrian boardwalk around bridge to access stormwater pond boardwalk.
