4. [22-00360](#) VETERANS MEMORIAL PARK FOUNDATION REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF THE TEMPORARY RESTROOMS LOCATED AT ADMIRAL MASON PARK

Recommendation: That City Council approve an extension permitting the temporary restrooms at Admiral Mason Park to remain for a period not to exceed one (1) year. Further, that the restrooms be open to the public.

Mayor Robinson addressed Council stating that staff has been working over the last year with the Veterans Memorial Park Foundation to finalize a plan for permanent restroom facilities. He indicated that at the June Council meeting (6/16) he plans to bring forward an item for Council's consideration to approve purchase of the temporary restroom with the caveat that the Foundation will use those funds for the building of permanent restroom facilities and the City can use the portable facilities at other City locations for other events.

Discussion ensued. During discussion reference was made to the continuing costs of the lawsuit related to the temporary restrooms. Mayor Robinson, City Administrator Fiddler, and Deputy City Administrator Forte, City Attorney Pepler, and Finance Director Lovoy responded accordingly to comments and questions. Paul Entrekin, President of the Veterans Memorial Park Foundation also responded to questions.
