DISCUSSION

22-00211 RULING IN VICKERY V. CITY OF PENSACOLA (NORTH SPRING STREET HERITAGE OAK) - REQUEST FOR REHEARING

Council President Hill (sponsor) requested City Attorney Pepler to provide an update on the First District Court of Appeals February 16, 2022 decision in *Vickery v. City of Pensacola* and the potential to file a motion for rehearing. **City Attorney Pepler provided a summary of the requirements of file a motion for rehearing and that Assistant City Attorney Lindsay is looking into the possibility of filing of such rehearing. He indicated that he will report back to City Council by 2/24 advising on the impacts of a bill going through the legislature at this time and any impacts it may have on this case if passed and signed by the governor.**
