# Objectives of this Survey for Pensacola Young Professionals

- To provide information, venues, and vehicles to build consensus towards a shared vision and the identification, adoption and implementation of specific plans to improve the quality of life in Escambia County and the City of Pensacola. These plans will be articulated, documented and publicized. Opportunities will be created to help hold responsible authorities, institutions, and elected officials accountable.
- To help build the critical mass, political will, courage and accountability required to rally the community, institutions, business and policy makers to affect the needed changes in behaviors, political culture, policy, structure and investment.
- To convey a message of hope and opportunity. Recognize and celebrate what is working and what has been accomplished. Escambia and Pensacola are wonderful places with loving and caring people. There is great potential for every element of the community.

# Validity and Reliability

This poll was conducted by Mason-Dixon Polling Strategy, Inc of Washington, D.C. in late fall 2021.

Mason-Dixon is a nationally known independent polling group. This insures non-biased data that uses proven strategies for polling.

Those interviewed were selected randomly from the commercially available Florida State voter registration file and fairly reflected the demographics of the Escambia County voting population.

800 total voters

The margin of error was below 5%, meaning that the "true" figure would fall within a less than 5% range of difference if the entire population (all voters) were sampled.

In order to have a more robust and statistically significant data set for the black voting population concerning race specific questions, an oversample was conducted

Most questions were asked with 5 options. In this analysis:


- Excellent, Good = Positive

## Are things heading in the Right Direction or Wrong Direction for...?


#### **Escambia County**

For the first time since 2015, the percentage of those polled who believe we're on the right track went down regarding the county


City of Pensacola





What is the primary reason you think the Quality of Life will worsen?





## Quality of life as a place to live for... Families with children









## How do you rate Escambia County in.... Public Transportation



# How do you rate Escambia County in.... Quality of the Public Schools




# How do you rate Escambia County in.... Job Opportunities in Your Field




# How do you rate Escambia County in.... Effective Leadership from elected officials










## How likely are you to move out of area?



## How would you rate economic conditions in Escambia county?





## How do you rate availability of affordable housing in Escambia County?




