

Member Bruni inquired regarding the status of the Neighborhood Challenge Grant that was submitted by the Scenic Heights Neighborhood Association last year. Interim Director, Byrd responded that the Neighborhood Grants are handled through the Neighborhood Services Department with Kelsey Powell as the contact person. Interim Director, Byrd shared that she had met with Ms. Brittany Ellers to make recommendations to her for the proposed park project regarding the budget and the durability of the proposed amenities.

Chairperson Hicks invited Deputy City Administrator, Miller to offer her insights to the board regarding Neighborhood Grants. Deputy City Administrator, Miller stated the Neighborhood Challenge Grant is a cumbersome process and administration is working on updating and

simplifying the process to have clarity of who reviews the application, who approves, and how it is awarded and the timeline of awarding the grant. Deputy City Administrator, Miller added she will be following up on the application to see that the grant moves along as expeditiously as possible. Some staffing changes will take place first of the new fiscal year and Neighborhood Services will be absorbed into Economic Development Department so Kelsey Powell will be reporting to Director Erica Grancagnolo.

Nikki Gray, Special Events Supervisor brought before the board a presentation (on file with background material) providing an overview of the process to permit a special event if the event will involve state road and lane closures.



September 21, 2023

PARKS UPDATES:

- Bayview Park Erosion Control/Stabilization Project Pre-Construction Phase: Anticipated start during first week of October; Approximately 60 days (weather permitting)
- Bruce Beach Phase I Construction Phase: Installation of landscaping, site lighting, and trees has commenced.
- Bruce Beach Phase 2 Pre-Construction Phase; anticipated completion end of summer 2024.
- Mallory Heights #2 Drainage Improvements Engineering and design phase
- Roger Scott Tennis Courts Construction Phase; asphalt should start going down next week; anticipated completion Winter 2023.

SPECIAL PROJECTS:

- Bay Bluffs Structural Assessment Temporarily closed; Boardwalk contains a considerable amount of rot and deterioration. Researching grants and other funding sources for providing future improvements and access.
- Roger Scott Pool Building Design Phase; Replacing restrooms, pool operations offices, and equipment/chemical storage.
- Sanders Beach Park Amenities Upgrade and Kayak Launch Project Design Phase; FWC awarded the grant for development of an ADA accessible kayak launch and other park improvements.
- 17th Avenue Boat Ramp and Pedestrian Access Design Phase; Public Works managing project for improvements to the boat ramp, pedestrian boardwalk around bridge to access stormwater pond boardwalk.

- Dance classes started at the end of August.




