




### Resource Navigation


As the front door to the entrepreneur ecosystem, we aim to connect entrepreneurs with organizations and individuals that can provide resources for growth and development.



# **Triage Process**



Emergency rooms in hospitals have a long-standing approach of triaging patients. We have applied this principal to how we manage people who come to us for help.

People can access help by walking into The Spring, calling, emailing or filling out a form online. Each intake is assessed and triaged with the specific help they need.

#### Examples include:

Referrals to the SBDC for help with business planning

capital, hiring talent, expanding services and growing jobs.

- Advice to connect with accounting services to help to review financials
- Connection to the City for bids and RFP's
- Mentorship by one of the SCI team



### Venture Mentoring Service Illi VM





The **Spring Venture Mentoring Service (VMS)** is based on the successful model used by the renowned VMS program at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

The MIT VMS is tailored specifically to communities looking to bolster entrepreneurship, and SCI has brought their successful program back to Pensacola.

Our program offers confidential, team mentoring services to entrepreneurs across our community. By **pairing entrepreneurs with 3-5 experts**, their ventures are exposed to a variety of very skilled expertise and advice. This program is offered to entrepreneurs **free of charge**.

Ventures from any industry are welcome to apply. The only eligibility requirement is the business is currently earning revenue.

### Collective Needs Assesment

Fostering entrepreneurship has become a core component of economic development in cities and countries around the world. Research shows that **entrepreneurs face many challenges** including excessive bureaucracy at the government level, scare early-stage capital and lack of mentorship help.

In 2015, a group of 25 people in our community, from a variety of business service backgrounds began meeting. The group included people from:

- UWF
- SBDC
- · SCI
- PSC
- Southern Company
- Florida West
- Lenders and Angel Networks

The goal was to begin conversations around an Entrepreneurial Support Organization and Ecosystem mapping, to help remove roadblocks and promote entrepreneurship in the Pensacola Metro Community.

#### WHY WE DO IT

### Gap In Services

The Entrepreneurial Ecosystem Group (EEG) worked together for several years to map resources and assess the needs of entrepreneurs in our area. It continues to meet to this day.

Fast forward to 2019, SCI in collaboration with FloridaWest Economic Development Alliance, The University of West Florida Center for Entrepreneurship, The Greater Pensacola Chamber of Commerce and the Gulf Coast Minority Chamber of Commerce conducted a survey to assess the gaps in services.

The survey revealed the 3 primary needs:

- 1. Access to Capital
- 2. Mentorship
- 3. Space

### Thus, The Spring was born with four primary objectives:

- 1) Ensure entrepreneurs in the community are aware of all the resources available to them within the Pensacola's entrepreneurial ecosystem
- 2) Give entrepreneurs the space to build their business
- 3) Provide a prestigious mentoring service to entrepreneurs through the Venture Mentoring Service
- 4) Ultimately, to help businesses grow and stay in the Pensacola area.

# Small Businesses Drive The Economy



Small businesses of 500 employees or fewer make up 99.9% of all U.S. businesses and 99.7% of firms with paid employees.

Of the new jobs created between 1995 and 2020, small businesses accounted for 62%—12.7 million compared to 7.9 million by large enterprises.
