Stakeholder-driven, non-regulatory program


>Involves community in the decision-making process

> Develops measurable goals for environmental health


>Utilizes long-term strategic planning (CCMP) to prioritize action

Comprehensive Conservation & Management Plan











Protecting What Matters

- Since 2018, over \$4.8 million has been secured
- Developed the watersheds' first CCMP

Enhanced and expanded monitoring, including:
 Water quality, sediment quality, wetland, seagrass and oyster mapping, and fish trawling

- Reached over 5,000 individuals between Florida and Alabama
- Engaged over 250 stakeholders through meetings and events
- > Awarded 18 Community Grants totaling \$450,000



City of Pensacola Highlights

> PPBEP has leveraged **\$441 for every \$1** contributed by the City





Priorities for FY 22-23

- Secure National Estuary Program Designation from Congress
- Release the first ever State of the Bays Report Card (October 2022)
- > Implement priority actions of the CCMP, including:
 - Securing funding for Carpenter Creek restoration
 - Securing funding for Pensacola Bay System Oyster Restoration Initiative
 - Securing funding for a Living Shoreline Cost Share Program
- Compound flood model and adaptation planning
