






CEMP Provides


- Framework for citywide preparedness, essential personnel, communications, safe guarding records, alerting procedures and chain of command.
- Public Announcements come from The Office of the Mayor
 - Public information officer (PIO)
- Incident Commander (IC)
- Emergency Manager
- Emergency Management Team





Citywide Critical Response priorities:

- Life Safety & Ability to Respond
- Protection of Property, both Private and City Assets and Facilities
- Minimize damage and losses; Recovery
- Maintain or Reconstitute Critical City Services
- Foundation for the continued survival of Leadership
- Continued Operations of All City Services (COOP)
- Compliance with Legal and Statutory Requirements



Activation and Authority:


- State of Emergency Declared
 - Escambia County Emergency Operations Center (EOC) is the leading authority
- Mayor, his designee, the Emergency Management Coordinator (EMC), Chief of Fire. In accordance with the City Charter.
- Institute protective action to protect life, health, and safety of citizens, visitors, tourists, and employees, and to protect public and private property.



Emergency Operations

City of Pensacola Emergency Coordination Center:

- 475 East Strong Street – Fire Admin. Building
- Staffing EMT:
 - Mayor, City Administrator, EMC, Fire Chief, Police Chief, Sanitation & Public Works Directors.
- Liaisons at Escambia County EOC
 - Updates to City EMC every 4 hours

- Radios, Phone System, Conference Call Bridge, Video Teleconference System,
- GETS & WPS, Fiber Optic Ring, Webpage & Citizens Information Center (CIC)

- Generators









 - FEMA Tracking if Declared Emergency
- Long-Term Recovery
 - Permanent Repair, Demolition, and Reconstruction of Facilities and Infrastructure
 - Long-Term Closures
 - Post Disaster Redevelopment
