**RECOMMENDATION:** 

That City Council approve an expanded scope for Phase 3 of the Port's Barracks Street Intermodal Project and the Port Administration Building and issuance of a change order to the contract with Green-Simmons Company in an amount not to

exceed \$53,610.

**SUMMARY:** 

On November 18, 1999, Council awarded the bid for Phase 3 of the Barracks Street Intermodal Expansion Project and the Port Administration Building to Green-Simmons Co., Inc. This final phase of the Intermodal project is designed to relieve current and future congestion on the Port and on adjacent streets, notably Main Street.

The project is on budget and is proceeding well. This expanded scope will improve the physical appearance on and around the site. This is considered important, as the Port's neighbors are the Historic and Redevelopment districts. Due to the availability of FSTED funds, only \$26,845 in Port Capital is necessary. The additional elements of the work are:

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- \$10,050 Guard House: Fencing
- \$10,130 Administration Building: Additional Brick, Sidewalk Extension and Electrical Modifications

- \$22,000 Parking Lot (southern portion), Guard House and Admin. Building: Landscaping and Irrigation

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

That City Council approve an expanded scope for Phase 3 of the Port's Barracks Street Intermodal Project and the Port Administration Building and issuance of a change order to the contract with Green Simmons Company in an amount not to exceed \$53,160.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

On November 18, 1999, Council awarded the bid for Phase 3 of the Barracks Street Intermodal Expansion Project and the Port Administration Building to Green-Simmons Co., Inc., of Pensacola, Florida. Phase 3 is the final phase of the Barrack Street project which is designed to relieve current and future congestion on the Port and on adjacent streets, notably Main Street. This final phase constructs a Parking Lot, Guard House, and Maintenance Building.

The project costs are on budget. The Port is very pleased with the quality of the completed work thus far. Due to project location, the Port is aware of its neighbors – the Historic and Redevelopment districts – and the need to maximize coexistence from a physical appearance standpoint. With this in mind, the expanded scope of work is to improve the physical appearance on and around the site. This is accomplished by additional landscaping, fencing, and brick at highly visible areas. The improved areas are: the corner of Barracks and Main street (at Gulf Power station); the land east of Barracks Street (adjacent to Pitt Slip); the Parking Lot (entrance).

The expanded scope will cost \$53,610. However, due to the availability of Florida Seaport Transportation and Economic Development (FSTED) Council grant and bond funds, only \$26,845 in Port Capital funds will be required. The elements of this work are as follows:

- \$10,050 Guard House: Fencing (east of Barracks Street/Pitt Slip)
- \$11,430 Parking Lot (Barracks & Main Street): Landscaping, Irrigation, and Sidewalk Extension
- \$10,130 Administration Building: Additional Brick, Sidewalk Extension and Electrical Modifications
- \$22,000 Parking Lot (east of Barracks Street/Pitt Slip; entrance), Guard House and Admin. Building: Landscaping and Irrigation

The existing contract with Green-Simmons currently has a 5% contingency. This contingency has been used for unforeseen items: wet soil causing a foundation redesign for the Administration Building; elevator redesign; stormwater design modifications as required by Florida Department of Environmental Protection; and design modifications in the plumbing for the Maintenance Building to meet the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements. An additional 5% project contingency will also be added.
