Mission & Goal



To pursue the development of a monument that would honor the military women who have served their country and provide often unmet critical resources for female Veteran care.

The Monument to Women Veterans Foundation advocates the establishment of a national monument recognizing the service and sacrifices of all women who have proudly donned a United States armed services uniform, but further seeks to provide resources and services for a myriad of issues currently impacting Women Veterans to include PTSD/MTBI, sexual assault, sexual harassment, unemployment, homelessness and countless others that may arise in the future.



The Ask



- A hundred year lease of existing run-down Amtrak Train Station building with MWV taking over maintenance which is currently costing the city considerable dollars
- In the unlikely event that Amtrak should at some time in the future want to return and need a station, arrangements would be made for MWV to relinquish the building for use as the Pensacola train station once again if the city so desired.
- MWV would make the necessary repairs and renovation for use of the deteriorating building as a beautiful museum with educational programs for children and adults.
- Having this amazing museum to honor our female veterans will provide the city with an excellent means to dispel the long history this city has for prejudicial neglect of women.



The Benefit



Having this museum and monument to women veterans creates a 9 million dollar economic impact that will undoubtedly benefit the city tremendously.

Additions to arts and cultural offerings have been proven to increase the desirability for other business and industry to come to cities with such offerings. Thus, further adding to city's revenues without having to increase individual's taxes.
