





Escambia Long Term Recovery Group





Florida Impacts

- 6.5 Million Evacuated
- 700 Shelters Opened
- 2.6 Million Registrants for FEMA Individual Assistance
- \$385 Million FEMA Verified Loss
- \$89.9 Million Unmet Needs over \$1,000
 - 15,376 registrants with unmet needs 65 or older
 - 17,647 households with children under age 12


