Examples of Diversity and Inclusion in the Commemoration:

Flag Raising Ceremony

- Collaborating with West Florida Genealogical Society to identify people who were in
 Pensacola and attended likely at the flag exchange ceremony in 1821. Focus is inclusive
 gender, age, socio economic standing, ethnicity, etc. will all be reflected in the results.
 This project will highlight our diverse heritage in a dynamic manner. We will have
 individuals at the July 2021 event representing each of those identified from our past.

St. Michaels Cemetery grave marking

- Dr. Jamin and Ms. Renea are leading the St. Michael's Cemetery Foundation project to identify all people from the early Territorial Period buried in the cemetery with an emphasis on people of color in the cemetery.
