1. <u>21-00370</u> PRESENTATION - PENSACOLA PERDIDO BAYS ESTUARY PROGRAM - DONALD KILLORN

Recommendation: That City Council accept a presentation from Donald Killorn regarding the Pensacola Perdido Bays Estuary Program.

Donald Killorn, Executive Director of Pensacola Perdido Bays Estuary Program provided an overhead presentation (on file with background materials) updating Council. Some Council Members made follow-up remarks, as well as Mayor Robinson.

5. <u>21-00363</u> VETERANS MEMORIAL PARK RESTROOM - RESCIND AND AMEND PREVIOUS ACTON

Recommendation: That City Council rescind and amend their action taken on March 25, 2021 regarding the placement of a temporary restroom trailer at Admiral Mason Park. Further that the location be changed to the parking spaces located in the right of way of East Romana Street subject to application for and issuance of event permits as required for special events. Finally, that the city work with all parties concerned for the construction of a permanent restroom facility within Veterans Memorial Park or such suitable location after the requisite board reviews and inspector approvals.

Council President Moore indicated he is aware there may be pending litigation related to this issue and asked for clarification. City Attorney Woolf indicated a lawsuit has been filed as of this morning and advised Council it would be in best interest of the City to pull this item and she can meet with Council Members individually regarding details of the filing. Council Member Myers (sponsor) asked questions regarding who is listed as defendant(s) which City Attorney Woolf indicated Veteran Memorial Park and Grover C. Robinson, IV in his official capacity as mayor. Council Member Myers made follow-up remarks indicating she does not agree this item should be pulled. Mayor Robinson also made remarks.

A motion was made by Council Member Broughton and seconded by Council Member Hill that this item be <u>removed from the agenda</u>.

Some discussion took place with City Attorney Woolf fielding comments and questions. Mayor Robinson also provided input.

6. <u>2021-22</u> RESOLUTION NO. 2021-22 - PROVIDING FOR A MORATORIUM ON THE EVICTION OF HOMELESS INDIVIDUALS WITHIN THE CITY OF PENSACOLA

Recommendation: That City Council adopt Resolution No. 2021-22:

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PENSACOLA DECLARING A MORATORIUM ON THE EVICTION OF HOMELESS INDIVIDUALS ENCAMPED UNDER THE I-110 OVERPASS AND WITHIN THE HOLLICE T. WILLIAMS PARK IN THE CITY OF PENSACOLA; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

Mayor Robinson addressed current efforts of staff working with outside agencies to aid individuals and that Neighborhoods Administrator Powell should have an update for Council at the end of May – beginning of June timeframe. Council Members Hill and Myers (co-sponsors) explained their intent for bring this resolution forward.

7. <u>2021-20</u> RESOLUTION NO. 2021-20 - COMMITTING TO 30% RENEWABLE ENERGY BY 2030 FOR CITY-OWNED FACILITIES AND OPERATIONS.

Recommendation: That City Council adopt Resolution No. 2021-20:

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PENSACOLA, FLORIDA RECOMMENDING A COMMITMENT BY THE CITY TO MEET A 30% RENEWABLE ENERGY TARGET BY 2030 FOR CITY-OWNED FACILITIES AND OPERATIONS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

DISCUSSION

12. <u>21-00364</u> CREATION OF A COMMITTEE TO DEVELOP A LOGO AND TAG LINE FOR THE CITY, TO AVOID COSTS OF SUCH ACTION EACH TIME A NEW MAYOR IS ELECTED

Council Member Myers (sponsor) explained her intent for bringing this discussion forward (as outlined in the memorandum in the agenda package) that with the previous and current administrations, when a newly elected mayor comes into office a new branding effort takes place, with a new logo and new tag line. Each time this takes place, it comes at a cost to taxpayers. Although costs associated with the current administration's changes were minimal, the previous administration spent an exorbitant amount of money.

Discussion took place among Council with input from Mayor Robinson. During discussion, reference was made to the City's seal and City Attorney Woolf clarified City Code Section 1-1-2 describes what it should look like.

There was not a consensus among Council to further explore this issue.

21-00384 REMOVAL OF TWO DERELICT VESSELS - THE ST. ANTHONY AND THE OLIVER

City Administrator Wilkins explained the issues related to the derelicts vessels (as outlined in the memorandum provided at Council's places - - on file) which are a result of Hurricane Sally last September. He responded accordingly to questions. Mayor Robinson also provided input.

There was not a consensus among Council to consider funding the removal of the vessels.
