Mr. Wilson indicated his comments represent the concerns of the neighborhood and referenced petition signatures opposing the disposition of this property. (Council Member Myers provided copies to Council Members of the neighborhoods concerns and petition signatures - - on file with background information).

City Attorney Woolf responded accordingly to questions and provided clarification referencing Resolution No. 37-08 which Council at that time adopted an Affordable Housing Incentive Plan under Florida Statute 420.9076 (provided in the agenda package and on file with background materials) and that this parcel was included in the listing of properties for disposition as proposed this evening. She further indicated it is likely Council will need to adopt a resolution to remove the property from such list if it is not Council's desire to dispose of this parcel in accordance with the plan and statute.
