DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director Cooper brought the following reports:

* Bayview Resource Center was punch-listed. He would love to open to the public and have a ribbon cutting, but the Mayor is still concerned about COVID. Hoping to do something in January.

* Hitzman Park construction is underway, the fields should be complete by March, and the rest of the project by early April.

* Kiwanis Park is coming along, but due to the Federal grant, the process is taking longer than anticipated.

* Four or five new playgrounds will be installed soon. Woodcliff Park, Vickrey, and others.

* Hunter Pool will be torn down and the pool house will be rebuilt. Based on budget, it will be functional, not necessarily beautiful, although it will look nice.

* "Trips to Discover" website mentioned that Bayview Dog Park is one of the 10 best pet friendly beaches in Florida.

* Deja Dowdell has been selected as a Rising Star in Pensacola.

* Discussion followed re: Hurricane Sally damage, and the pro-shop at Roger Scott Tennis Center.

Park Regulations re: people in the parks after hours

Director Cooper mentioned that he will discuss the issue from the Parks and Recreation perspective. Homelessness is growing; they gather under I-110, the people need compassion. There is a team that is trying to formulate a plan to address and fund the issue.

PPD was invited to the Parks and Recreation Board meeting, but they were unable to attend.

Discussion by the Board followed. General consensus was that the Board

cannot do anything about the homeless, but parks should be there for the citizens to enjoy while they are open. After hours nobody should be in parks, and there should be no alcohol, drugs or indecency allowed at any time.

Bicycle Advisory Committee

Chairperson Hicks mentioned that the Emerald Coast Resource Council brought up the desire to reconvene the Bicycle Advisory Committee (BAC). Chairperson Hicks gave a brief history of the BAC. Technically the committee still exists, it is just suspended from meeting.

The initial purpose for the committee was to apply for the League of American Bicyclists Bicycle Friendly Community award. The Committee submitted the application, and attained an Honorable Mention. Steps have been taken on reducing the major weaknesses that were identified.

Chairperson Hicks thinks that the BAC should be responsible for recreational bicycling, with input from other bicycling groups. What would the Board like to do about the BAC? Would they want it to continue as a Council appointed committee of the Parks and Recreation Board, or should the recreational bicycling issues just be discussed at the Parks and Recreation Board meetings? Should the whole Board be a part of the Committee, or just a few members? When would the BAC meet, immediately following Parks and Recreation Board, or at a different time? Discussion followed. The BAC would need permission from Council prior to reconvening, but Chairperson Hicks was wondering whether or not to present the idea to Council. **Withdrawn**

Tips for Using the Community Park Audit Tool (CPAT)

- Drive, bike, or walk around the park to get a feel for what's in the park and the neighborhood around the park.
- Questions on the CPAT are grouped in sections in the order that you might come across them in a park.
 However, you may need to switch between sections or pages as you complete the park audit.
 Therefore, it is important to look through the tool before you begin.
- When you are finished, go back and make sure you have completed all the sections and questions.
- There is space at the end of each section where you can write down comments as you complete your audit. The margins or back of the page can be used to take notes, but make sure to transfer your comments into the answer spaces.
- If you see anything that requires immediate attention, contact the local parks department.
